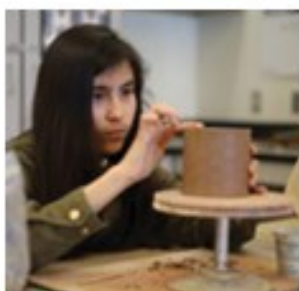

GENERAL INFORMATION

This course guide gives you information about courses that may be offered in Mount Vernon's Middle schools. We hope this guide will answer all of your questions as you decide what middle school courses to select for next year. To be a full time student you must enroll in 4 classes a day. The courses in this guide will be offered only if enough students register this spring to fill a class, so, it is very important that you think carefully your choices now so that the courses you want will be available next year. If you cannot find the answers you need, or if you would like to have individual help in planning your program, please contact a counselor at your school.

Middle School requirements are explained on the following pages. Use the planning sheets in this course guide to map out your 3 year Middle School path. We also encourage you to think about the sequence of courses you will want to take in high school. This way you will know what courses to choose in Middle School to be prepared for High School courses that interest you.

MIDDLE SCHOOL COURSE REQUIREMENTS ARE:

- Three years of English Language Arts
- Three years of Social Studies
- Three years of Mathematics
- Three years of Science
- Three semesters of Physical Education
- Three semesters of Health
- Three years of Electives, from the Arts (Fine, Performing, or Visual) or Technology Departments

Advisory/Home Court

Advisory is designed to help students with academic planning, personal and social development, and college readiness. Each student is assigned an advisor who works with a group of 18-25 students throughout their three years at middle school. Advisory groups meet regularly, and students are encouraged to contact their advisors if they need additional assistance.

Middle School Daily Instructional Schedules

Our Middle School schedule is an 8 period block schedule based on a semester system. Depending upon the Middle School, classes may meet every day or may meet every other day. Each course meets for approximately 85 minutes, with a full school day schedule of 4 courses each day.

HOW OUR SCHEDULE WORKS: MOUNT BAKER MIDDLE SCHOOL

Mount Baker's schedule is an 8 period block schedule based on a semester system. Four classes meet on Blue days and the other four meet on White days. Each course meets for approximately 80 minutes. Below is an example schedule for the year.

MIDDLE SCHOOL GRADING: REPORTING STUDENT PROGRESS

The purpose of grading is to communicate with students and families about progress toward academic standards and behaviors that promote school success. Mount Vernon Middle School student progress will be reported using standards-based grading and reporting instead of traditional letter grades. This practice allows us to provide more accurate and meaningful feedback to students and families, and is aligned with the practices we use at our elementary schools. (High school credit bearing courses will continue to earn traditional letter grades.)

The goal should always be to earn at least a 3 and then to challenge yourself to continue to grow as a learner. Students will have multiple opportunities to work towards earning a 3. Learning is a process and commitment to ongoing practice will support student success. Once you have met the middle school standards you can be confident you will be prepared for high school.

HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT FOR COURSES

High School Credit for Courses Taken in Middle School

Middle school students may earn high school credit for designated credit bearing courses offered at the middle level. High school credit for designated courses may be requested by completing the high school credit request form. The request can be made at any time up to the point of the student graduating from high school. It is strongly recommended this request be made prior to the end of a student's junior year. Please note that once the grades are recorded on the high school transcript, the grade and credit cannot be removed and are included in the computation of the students' grade point average. Designated courses include: Algebra 1, Geometry, Spanish I and Spanish II. Students who pass Washington State History in middle school will automatically earn a "MET" status on their high school transcript once students enter high school.

Looking Ahead to High School

A minimum of 30 credits are required for graduation from Mount Vernon High School.

- 6 credits are required to be a sophomore on track to graduate.
- 14 credits are required to be a junior on track to graduate.
- 22 credits are required to be a senior on track graduate.

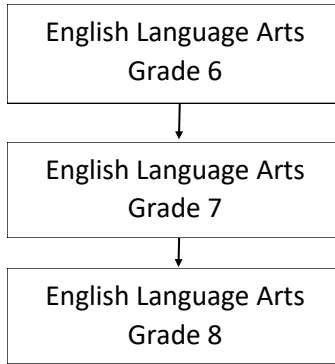

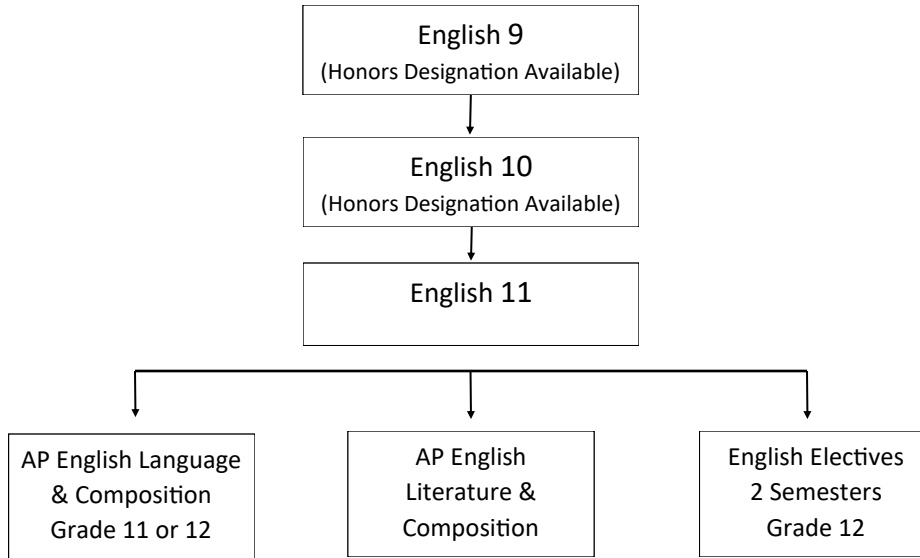

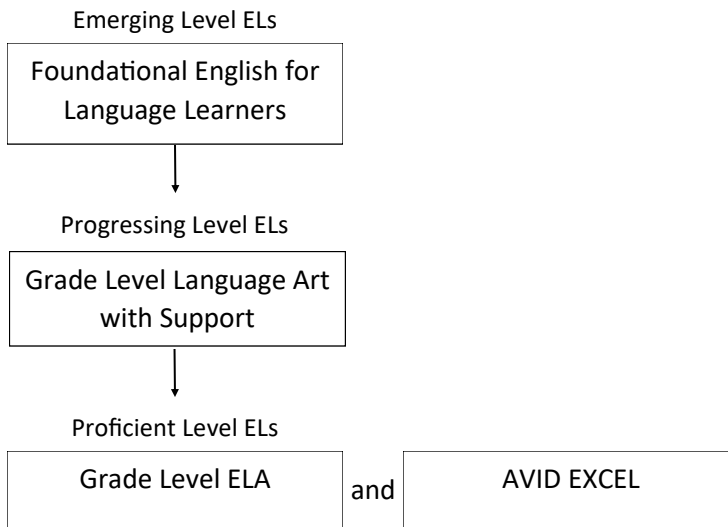

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Foundational English for Language Learners I, II, III:

ELA301 / ELA302 / Duration: Year

ELA311 / ELA312 /

ELA321 / ELA322

Prerequisite: qualified EL student

This course is designed to develop students' oral language abilities and basic literacy skills, using English language development curriculum and integrated project based learning. The students develop a strong vocabulary base of nouns, verbs, and adjectives which will be used in speaking, listening, reading, and writing projects.

6th English Language Arts:

ELA601 / ELA602 / Duration: Year

In this course, students continue to develop a variety of 6th grade level comprehension, writing, and vocabulary skills and strategies. Students actively seek to understand how an individual's identity and culture shape how they read, write, and experience the world. Using their full linguistic repertoire, students develop increasing sophistication in all aspects of language use (reading, writing, speaking, and listening). Students are supported in reading and writing grade level narrative, informational, and argumentative texts. Students grow their critical literacies, analyzing multiple perspectives and developing their critical consciousness and cross-cultural awareness. Students read a wide range of diverse, complex texts that are reflections of their lived experiences and windows into the experiences of others. Students read texts and topics of choice and write about issues and ideas they find meaningful in order to use their voice to contribute to a more just and equitable world. Students participate productively in groups, use constructive feedback to improve their work, evaluate their progress, and set future goals. Students continue to read and write for pleasure, sharing and reflecting on their experiences and the experiences of others.

6th English Language Arts Advanced:

ELA611 / ELA612 / Duration: Year

LaVenture Middle School

The course is aligned with the Common Core State Standards which include College and Career Readiness standards. ELA701 / ELA702 / Duration: Year

LaVenture Middle School

Prerequisite: teacher recommendation; academic readiness

This course includes the same content and experiences as 7th grade English Language Arts while infusing rigor that provides access to above grade level standards. The course is aligned with the Common Core State Standards which include College and Career Readiness standards. Reading, writing, speaking, listening, language, and collaborative strategies are used purposefully to build knowledge and skills and to help students become independent readers, writers, and thinkers as they continue to progressively build the skills necessary for academic success.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS COURSE DESCRIPTIONS (CONT.)

8th English Language Arts:

ELA801 / ELA802 / Duration: Year

In this course, students continue to develop a variety of 8th grade level comprehension, writing, and vocabulary skills and strategies. Students actively seek to understand how an individual's identity and culture shape how they read, write, and experience the world. Using their full linguistic repertoire, students develop increasing sophistication in all aspects of language use (reading, writing, speaking, and listening). Students are supported in reading and writing grade level narrative, informational, and argumentative texts. Students grow their critical literacies, analyzing multiple perspectives and developing their critical consciousness and cross-cultural awareness. 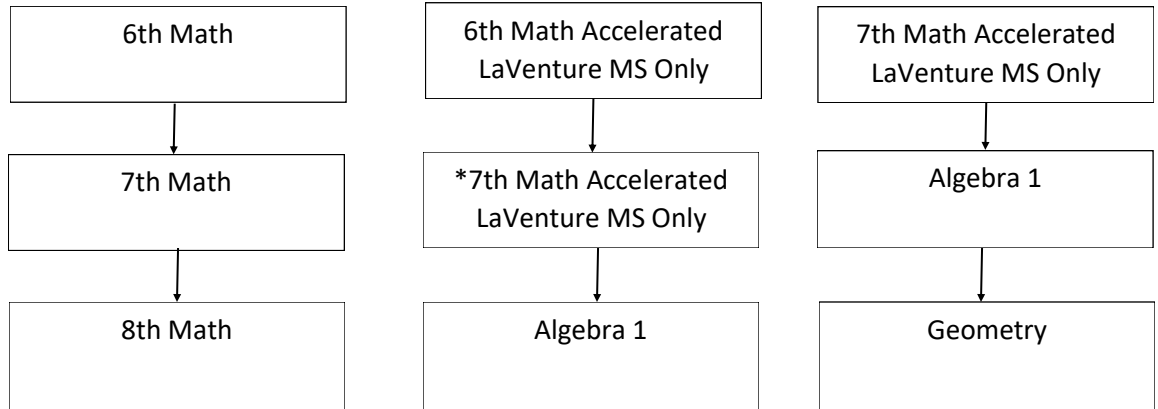

Reading, writing, speaking, listening language, and collaborative strategies are used purposefully to build knowledge and skills and to help students become independent readers, writers, and thinkers as they transition into high school. The primary goals of the course are to foster independent learning, encourage in-depth exploration of the content, and develop academic habits of mind.

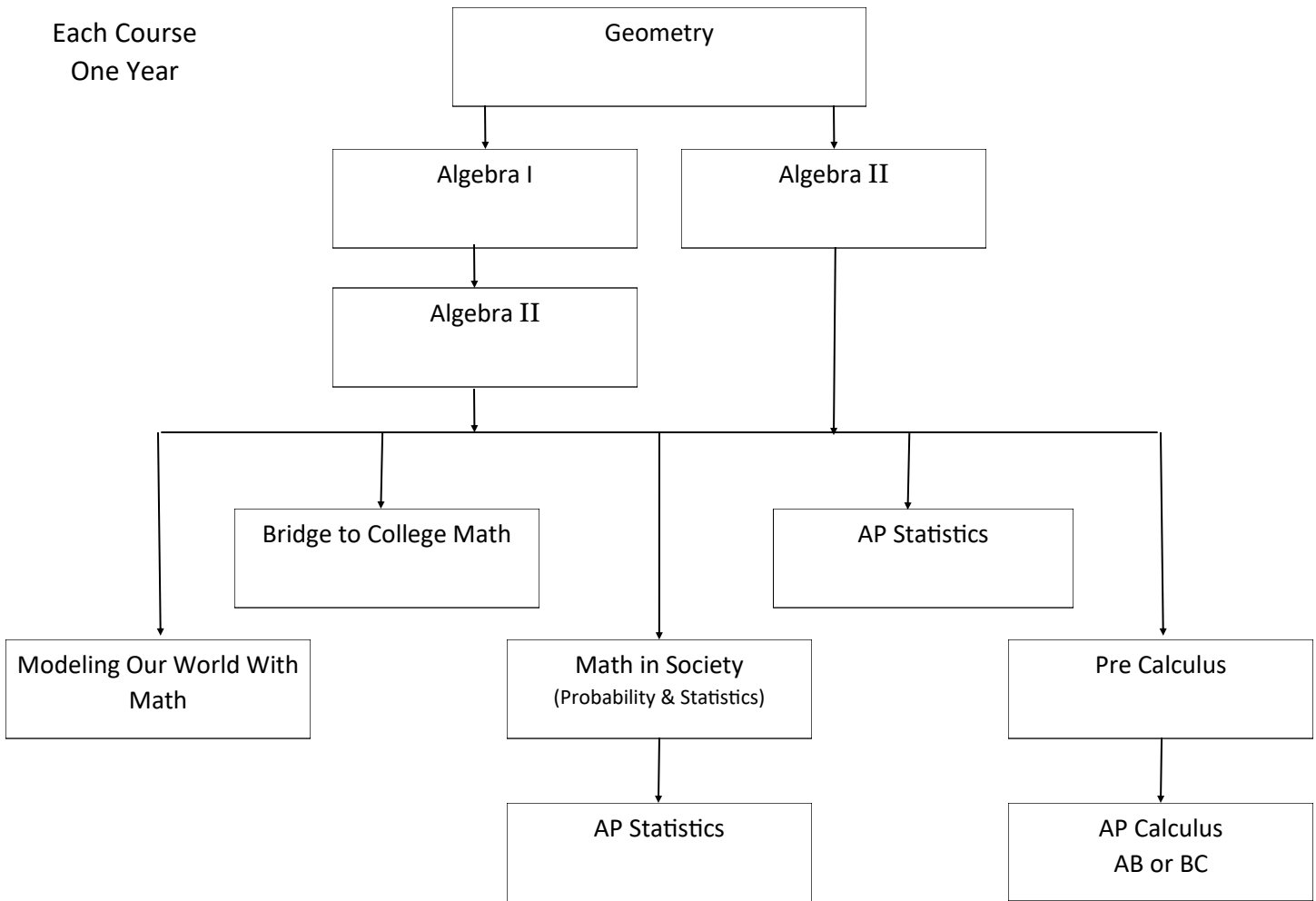

MATH COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

6th Math:

MTH601 / MTH602 / Duration: Year

Instructional time will focus on four critical areas: (1) connecting ratio and rate to whole number multiplication and division and using concepts of ratio and rate to solve problems; (2) completing understanding of division of fractions and extending the notion of number to the system of rational numbers, which includes negative numbers; (3) writing, interpreting, and using expressions and equations; and (4) developing understanding of statistical thinking.

6th Math Accelerated:

MTH621 / MTH622 / Duration: Year

LaVenture Middle School

Prerequisite: teacher recommendation

This is a challenging and rapid-paced course with an Instructional focus on all the 6th, 7th and 8th grade level math standards. Students that successfully complete this course will be eligible for enrollment in Algebra 1 in 7th grade. Admittance is based primarily on standardized test results and a readiness assessment.

7th Math:

MTH701 / MTH702 / Duration: Year

Instructional time will focus on four critical areas: (1) developing understanding of and applying proportional relationships; (2) developing understanding of operations with rational numbers and working with expressions and linear equations; (3) solving problems involving scale drawings and informal geometric constructions, and working with two- and three-dimensional shapes to solve problems involving area, surface area, and volume; and (4) drawing inferences about populations based on samples.

7th Math Accelerated:

MTH721 / MTH722 / Duration: Year

LaVenture Middle School

Prerequisite: teacher recommendation

This is a challenging and rapid-paced course with an Instructional focus on the 7th and 8th grade level math standards. Students that successfully complete this course will be eligible for enrollment in Algebra 1 in 8th grade. Admittance is based primarily on standardized test results and a readiness assessment.

8th Math:

MTH801 / MTH802 / Duration: Year

Instructional time will focus on three critical areas: (1) formulating and reasoning about expressions and equations, including modeling an association in bivariate data with a linear equation, and solving linear equations and systems of linear equations; (2) grasping the concept of a function and using functions to describe quantitative relationships; (3) analyzing two- and three-dimensional space and figures using distance, angle, similarity, and congruence, and understanding and applying the Pythagorean Theorem.

Algebra 1:

MTH082 / MTH084 / Duration: Year

Prerequisite: teacher recommendation; academic readiness assessment

Other Note: eligible for high school credit

Core topics include solving equations and systems of equations, linear, quadratic and exponential functions with a focus on problem solving.

Geometry:

A - MTH143 / B - MTH144 / Duration: Year

Prerequisite: Algebra 1

Other Note: eligible for high school credit

Core topics include angles, proofs, triangles, congruence, similarity, quadrilaterals, trigonometry, surface area and volume, and coordinate geometry. Concepts are taught with an emphasis on Algebra 1 skills.

SPECIAL EDUCATION COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Life Skills:

LFS400 / Duration: determined on individual basis

Prerequisite: IEP Team decision

Life Skills is a program built for students who need Specially Designed Instruction across domains and subjects. We focus on academics, social and emotional goals, and adaptive skills. We are able to provide a higher level of support and use this support to work on each student's IEP goals and to help them integrate into the general education population. We practice street safety, grocery shopping, cooking and more.

BEARS Program (Behaviors for Everyone with Advocacy, Respect & Self Discipline):

GDE400 / Duration: determined on individual basis

Prerequisite: IEP Team decision

This course is for students with IEP goals to support improving emotional / behavioral skills. A primary goal for this course is the development of personal responsibility for social, emotional and academic performance. This course is part of the Guide program of supports to teach specific skills to regulate their emotions and social responses, manage their feelings including anger, correct thinking errors, and increase appropriate social decision making and responsibility. Areas of academic need according to IEP goals may also be addressed within this course. The course utilizes a system of defined expectations and responsibilities which help students learn and apply new skills in all settings of the school campus. The system includes a daily communication system to teachers and parents, and daily tracking of student performance to individualize student supports.

Academic Learning Support

ALS600 / ALS700/ ALS800 / Duration: determined on individual basis

Prerequisite: must meet IEP goal

Students in Learning Lab class will have opportunity for individualized instruction based on focused areas using general education class materials for content. Students may receive teach-reteach, study strategy skills, self-determination instruction, etc. in addition to their specific areas of specially designed instructions.

Social, Academic and Executive Function Support

SLC400 / Duration: determined on individual basis

Prerequisite: IEP Team decision

The class is designed to meet the educational needs of students who have significant difficulties in the area of organizational skills, executive functioning skills and social competency skills that are often associated with autism spectrum disorders.

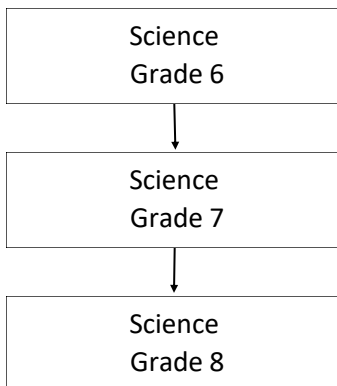
Using evidence-based practices, the goal is to provide instruction opportunities for application, knowledge, training and support to maximize independence and enhance students opportunities to achieve their full potential.

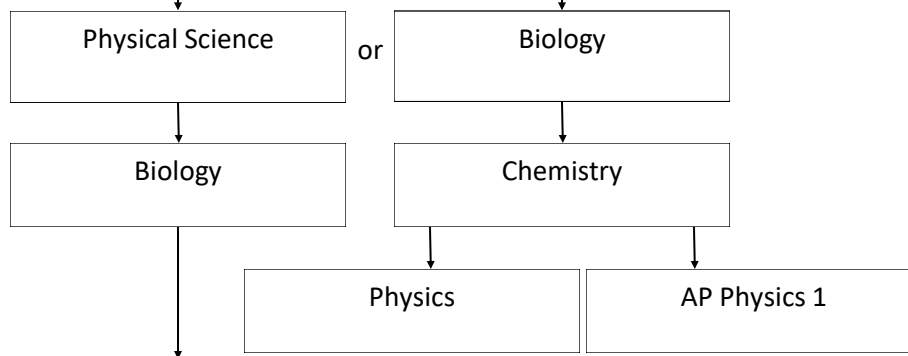

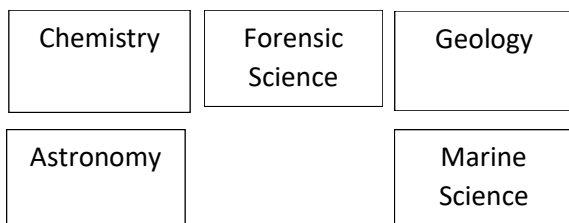

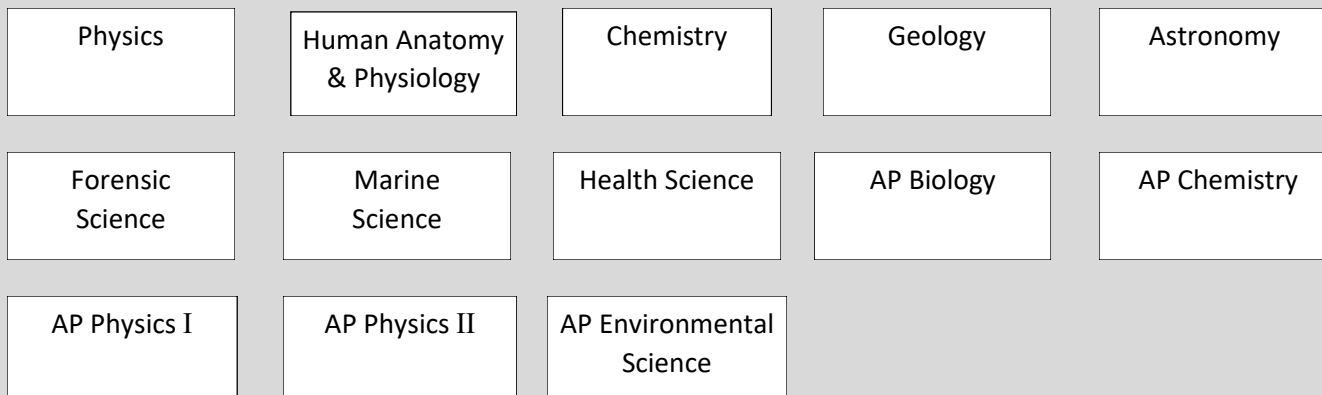

SCIENCE COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

6th Science:

SCI601 / SCI602 / Duration: Year

6th grade focuses on basic physics, and earth & space science. Students start by studying energy and then use that as a context to move into force and motion (Newtonian physics). Students build on that understanding to then move into light and waves and then finally finish up with earth and space science. In earth and space science students focus on stars, our solar system, earth's seasons, and phases of the moon.

6th Advanced Science:

SCI611 / SCI612 / Duration: Year

LaVenture Middle School

Students will learn about basic physics, earth and space science with opportunities to extend inquiry skills beyond what is expected in a regular 6th grade science class.

7th Science:

SCI701 / SCI702 / Duration: Year

7th grade focuses on geology and earth's systems. Students also start by studying energy at the beginning of the year and then move into the structure of the earth. Students will also learn plate tectonics, land forms, earthquakes, and volcanoes. From there students extend their knowledge to other geological hazards native to the Pacific Northwest and focus on the factors that influence landslides. The class will finish by studying the water cycle, weather patterns, and global climate change.

7th Advanced Science:

SCI711 / SCI712 / Duration: Year

LaVenture Middle School

Students will learn about geology and energy, and the structure of the earth. This will also include the geology of the Pacific Northwest. Students will have opportunities to extend inquiry skills beyond what is expected in their regular 7th grade science class.

8th Science:

SCI801 / SCI802 / Duration: Year

8th grade focuses on biology. Students start the year by studying energy and how it moves through ecosystems. Students split ecosystem units into smaller parts that investigate life. Students will also study cells with regards to form and function and finish up the year with genetics, natural selection, and evolution.

8th Advanced Science:

SCI811 / SCI812 / Duration: Year

LaVenture Middle School

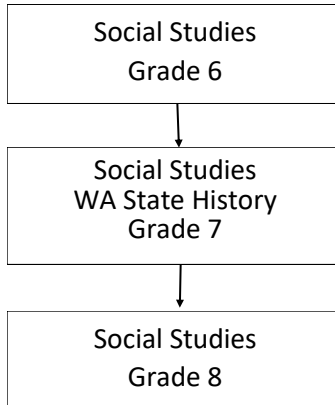
Students will learn about genetics, ecosystems, cells, and energy, just as in the standard 8th grade class. There will be an emphasis on the math, physical science standards and creating opportunities to extend their inquiry skills beyond that which is usually expected in a regular 8th grade science course.

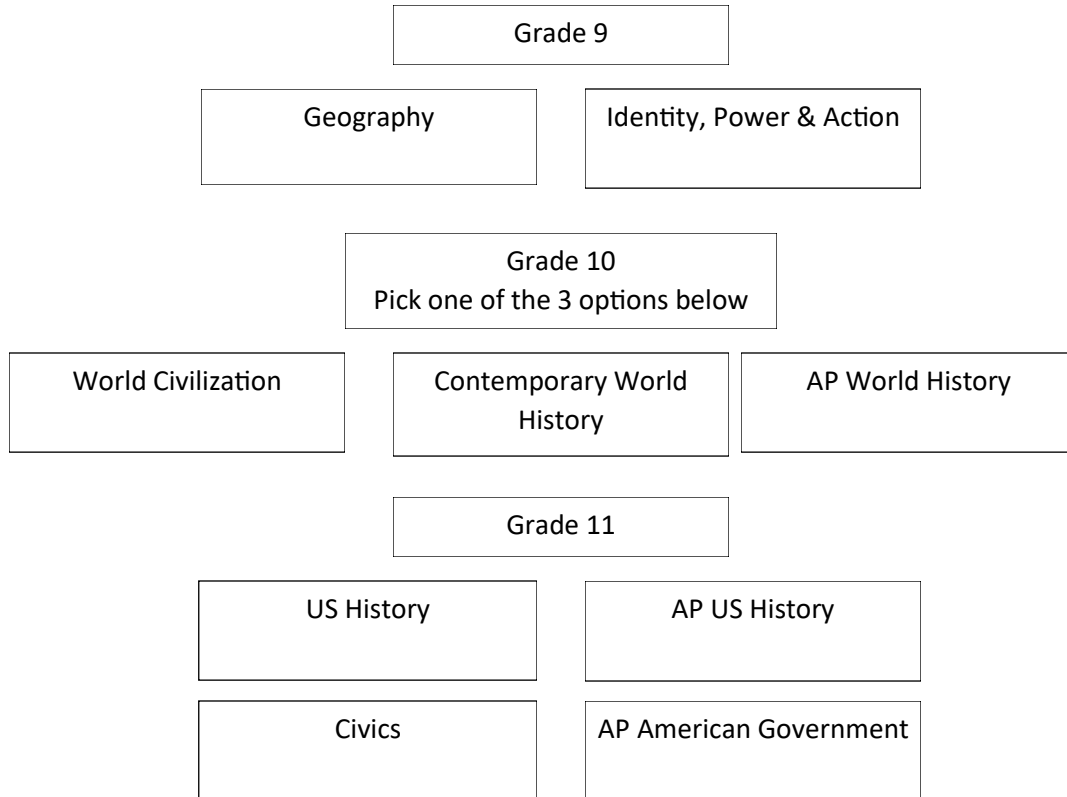

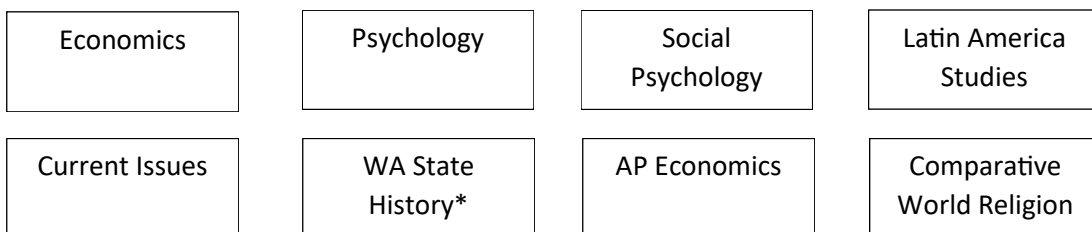

SOCIAL STUDIES COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

6th Social Studies:

SOC601 / SOC602 / Duration: Year

Explore the world of Ancient History through projects, simulations, and technology! Learn where the first humans lived, how technology developed, and when the first civilizations emerged around the world.

7th Washington State History & Civics:

SOC701 / SOC702 / Duration: Year

Learn about our own Washington State history, including Native American cultural and interactions. The emphasis of this course is to apply essential learning about civics and history to our state and local areas. Economic and geographic content will also be included.

Additional Note: Educational Milestone– Must pass in Middle School or High School to graduate.

8th Social Studies:

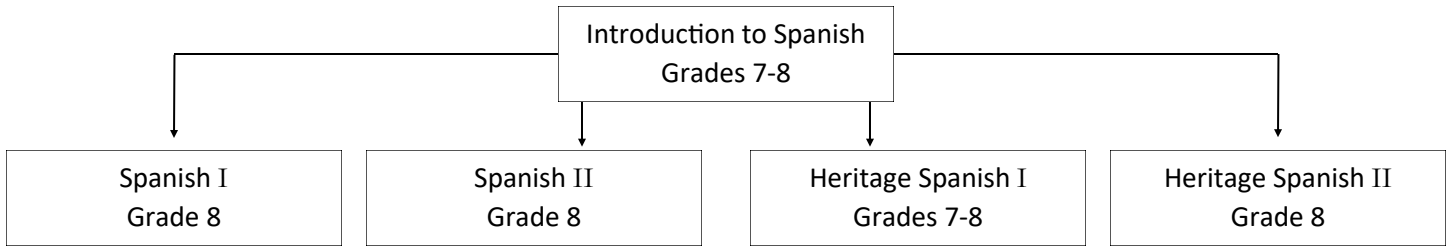
SOC801 / SOC802 / Duration: Year

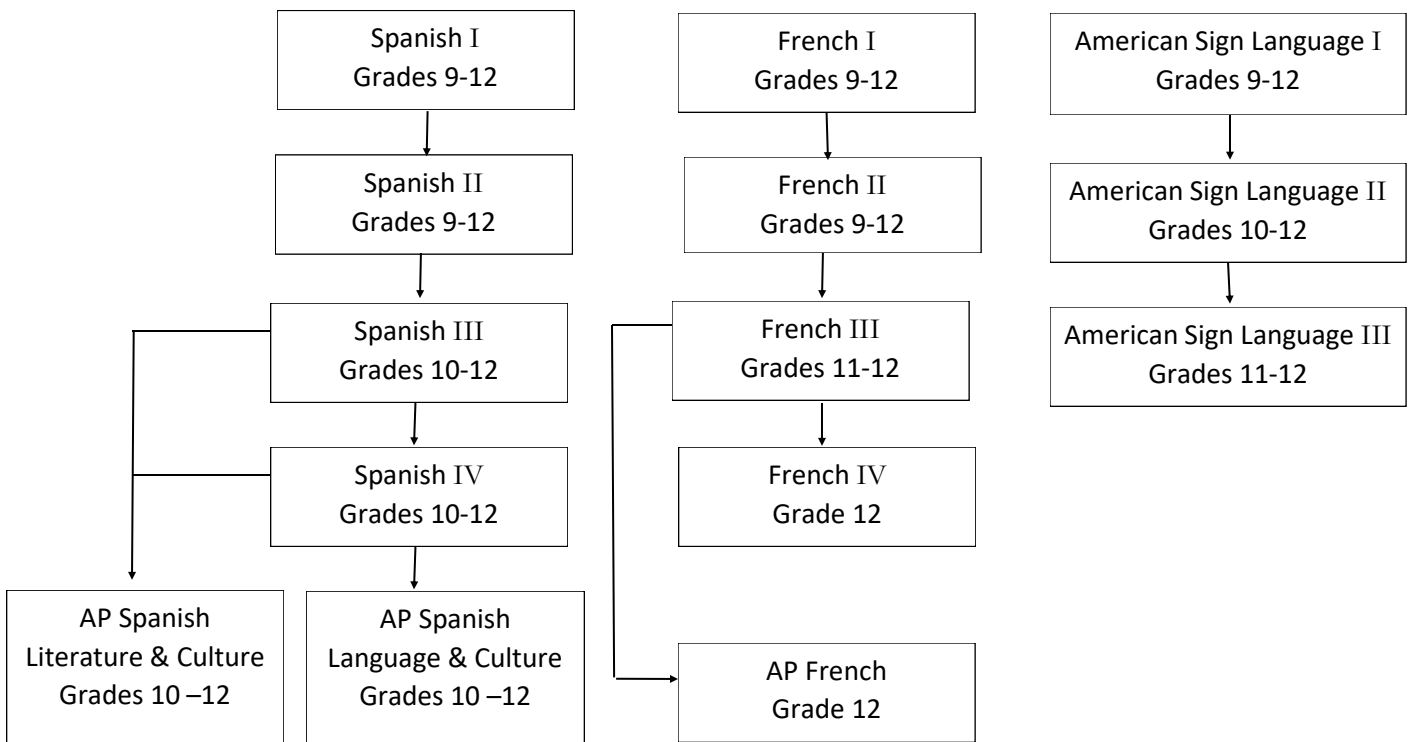

WORLD LANGUAGE COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Intro Spanish:

FLG200 / Duration: Semester

Grade: 7-8

Other Note: only able to take once

This class will provide you with a general introduction to the Spanish language: pronunciation, vocabulary, and basic grammar rules. We will work on 4 skills: listening, speaking, reading, and limited writing. This semester-long class is best for students with little or no experience with Spanish, or for students who are considering taking Spanish for high school credit their 8th grade year.

This course will allow students to explore the cultures of the Spanish-speaking world, including their own, and it will enable students to gain a better understanding of the nature of their own language.

Heritage Spanish II:

FLG002 / Duration: Year

Grade: 8

LaVenture Middle School

This year-long course is designed specifically for native or heritage speakers of Spanish who bring oral language proficiency and have been introduced to reading and writing in Spanish. The purpose of this course is to provide students whose heritage language is Spanish to build upon the language knowledge students bring and advance their proficiency of Spanish reading, writing, oral and auditory expression in multiple contexts and audiences. This course will allow students to explore the cultures and histories of the Spanish-speaking world, including their own, and it will enable students to gain a better understanding of the nature of their own language.

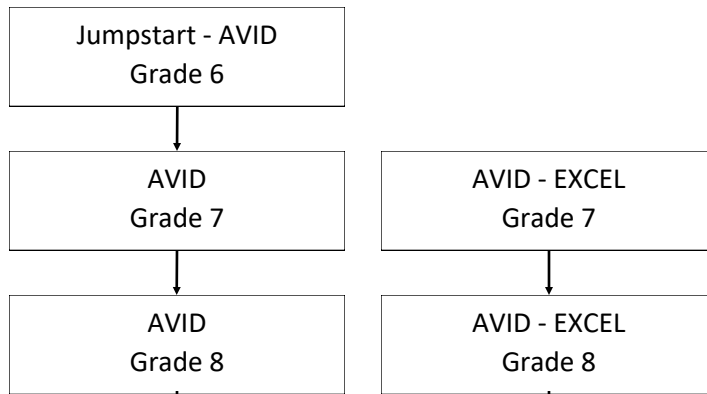

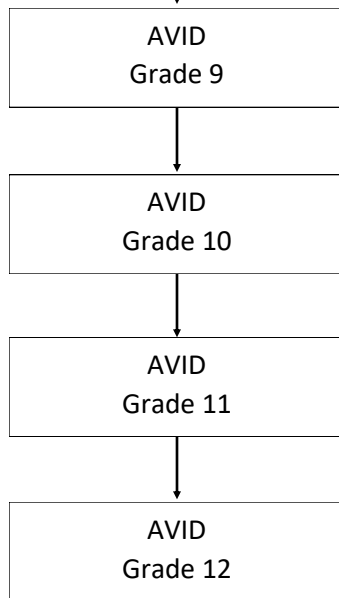

6th Health:

HEA600 / Duration: Semester

7th Health:

HEA700 / Duration: Semester

Students will learn information needed to make good health decisions. Each grade level is broken up into specific categories of focus. The units covered in this course will focus on motivating each student to voluntarily take a role in protecting, maintaining, and improving their health through responsible actions and decisions. 8th Health:

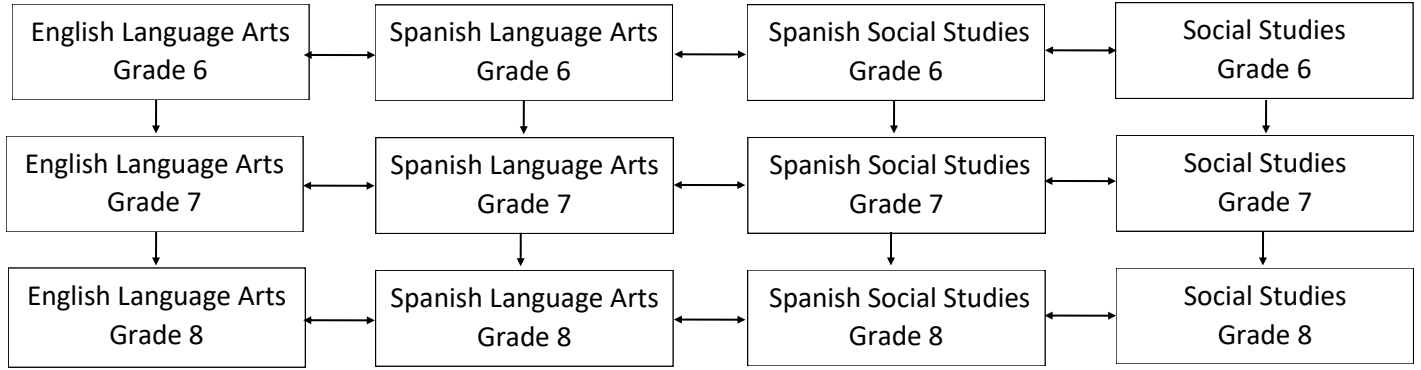

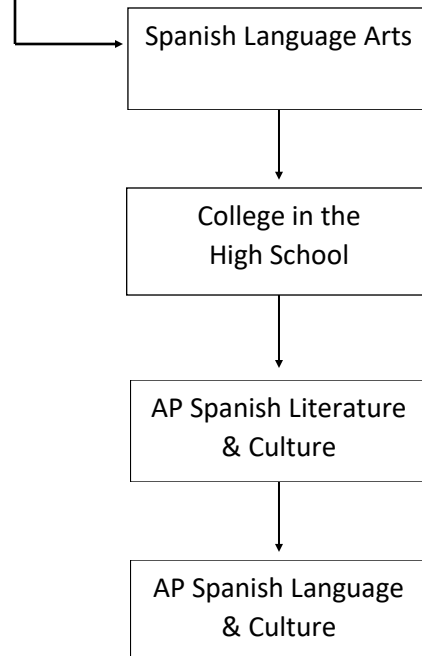

DUAL LANGUAGE PROGRAM (CONT.)

The goal of Mount Vernon's dual language program is to develop biliterate skills through the learning of core content learning standards. Literacy and social studies are integrated into the two languages to create learning environments that involve learning standards within a multicultural perspective. Our K-5 elementary program is housed at Madison Elementary and the middle school program is taught at LaVenture Middle School. Students receive 50% of their instruction in English and 50% in Spanish. The program includes students who are native speakers of English and Spanish.

Program Goals

1. Bilingualism and Biliteracy: Develop high levels of proficiency in two languages – Spanish and English
2. High levels of academic achievement: Perform at or above grade level in academic areas in both languages

DSS801 / DSS802 / Duration: Year

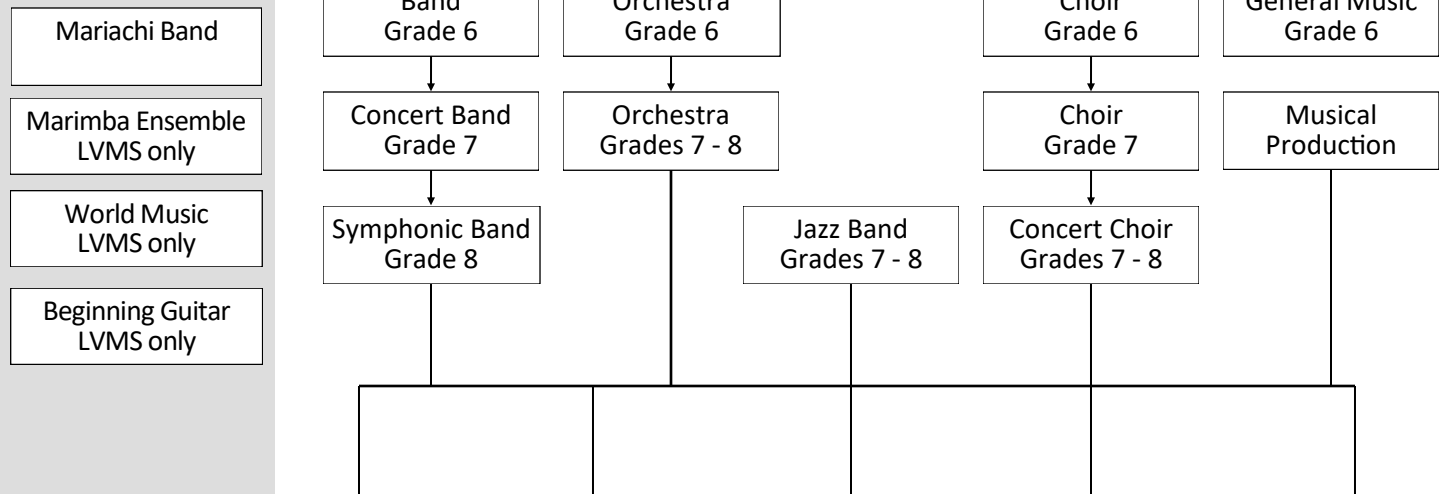

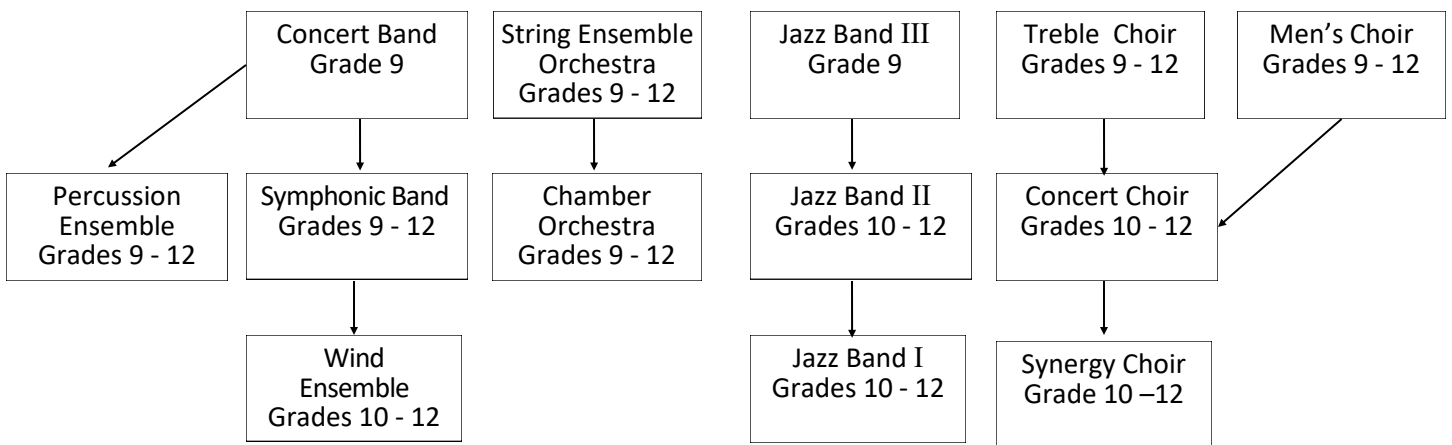

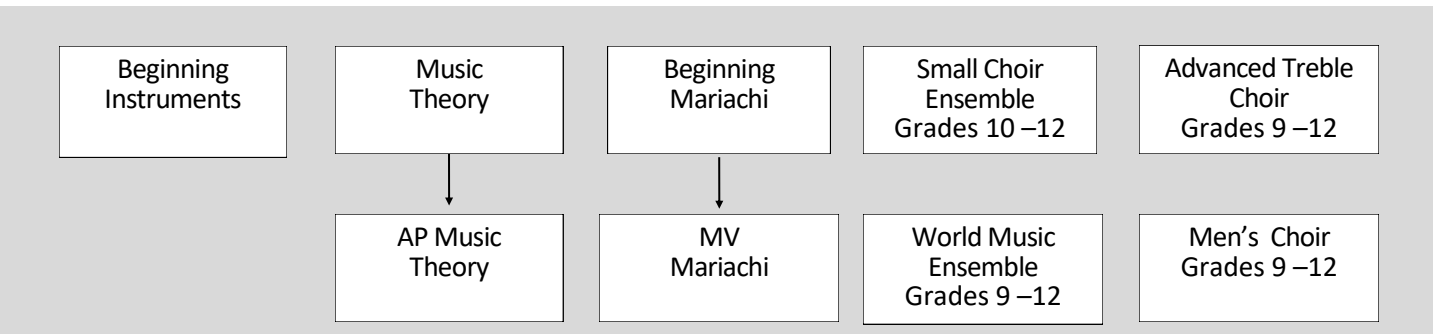

MUSIC COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Cadet Band:

BND201 / BND202 / Duration: Year

Grade: 6

This beginning band class is for anyone wanting to learn how to play a WIND instrument! This class does not teach guitar, piano, or drums, but if you want to be part of the band then this class is the place for you! Clarinet, flute, trumpet, trombone, or saxophone are good instruments for students to start with.

Concert Band:

BND211/ BND212 / Duration: Year

Grade: 7

Concert Band is an ensemble for 7th and 8th grade band students who want to continue playing an instrument but may not be ready for the rigor of Symphonic Band. This class reviews fundamentals, plays fun music, begins learning chamber music, and gets to perform in seasonal formal concerts.

Symphonic Band:

BND221 / BND222 / Duration: Year

Grade: 8

This class is for the serious musician who is ready to practice regularly and perform often. This class comes with the added responsibility of assembly performances, difficult chamber music, and many concerts.

Jazz Band:

BND231 / BND232 / Duration: Year

Grade: 7-8

Prerequisite: auditions required

This class is for the serious musician who is ready to practice regularly and perform often. This class comes with the added responsibility of many performances throughout the year.

Beginning Choir:

CHR201 / CHR202 / Duration: Year

Grade: 6

This class is a great introduction to middle school and high school choir. It is for those students who have been in choir before or just want to learn more about singing. You will get to experience the fundamentals of music in a fun and interactive way.

Falcon Choir:

CHR211 / CHR212 / Duration: Year

LaVenture Middle School

Grade: 7-8

Falcon Choir is open to 7th or 8th grade students who want to learn more about singing. If you have been in choir before or you're brand new, Falcon Choir is a great place to start your singing career. This class will teach you how to read music and prepare you for middle and high school choir.

Men's Choir:

CHR221 / CHR222 / Duration: Year

Mount Baker Middle School

Grade: 7-8

Justin Timberlake, Adam Levine, and Jason Mraz all started in choir! Are you a guy who wants to learn how to sing? This class is for you! This is a high energy choir class that gets to travel (during the school day), play a lot of games, learn to read music, and perform awesome songs together. It is less demanding than Concert Choir, but just as fun.

CHR231 / CHR232 / Duration: Year

Concert Choir:

CHR241 / CHR242 / Duration: Year

Grade: 8

LaVenture Middle School

Grade: 7-8

Prerequisite: auditions required

This is an audition class that is for the student who really wants to take choir to the next level. This class works incredibly hard, but gets to travel more often and perform in front of more audiences and participate at various festivals throughout the year. Advanced study of vocal production, note reading, sight singing, and choral ensemble singing is included.

MUSIC COURSE DESCRIPTIONS (CONT.)

Orchestra I:

ORC201 / ORC202 / Duration: Year
Grade: 6

This course is open to all who have successfully completed Fifth Grade Orchestra. Instead of coming before school, Orchestra is now part of your school day! Our music in middle school is more advanced than in elementary school as we continue to work on tone, intonation, balance, dynamics and music theory. We also begin playing in five-part harmony, as each section as their own part. Three evening concerts per year are required. Students who have not previously been in orchestra may be eligible to join with special permission from Ms. Watson.

Orchestra II:

ORC211 / ORC212 / Duration: Year
Grade: 7- 8

This course is open to all who have successfully completed Orchestra I. Orchestra is a performance-based course which requires student participation in day and evening performances. We build on what we have learned in Elementary and Sixth Grade Orchestra and take it to the next level. The orchestra will perform in a large group adjudication in the Spring.

Rhythm & Keyboards I & II:

MUS200/MUS210 / Duration: Semester
Mount Baker Middle School
Grade: 7-8

Students will learn to read rhythms in a fun, non-threatening atmosphere while drumming along with popular songs. Upon completion of the drumming unit, students will learn basic piano skills on Yamaha keyboards. No previous musical experience is necessary—we will start at the beginning using numbers and letters before learning to read music. Students will have completed the equivalent of almost any piano Book One by the end of this course. After passing off each required packet, students may use our classroom iPads to learn songs of their choice.

Mariachi Band

BND241 / BND242/ Duration: Year
Grade: 7-8

Mariachi is a performing ensemble that will learn and play traditional mariachi style music. Students will learn to play an instrument as well as sing traditional songs in Spanish. This is a class open to current trumpet and violin students, as well as anyone interested in learning mariachi style guitar. Guitar players need no previous experience. Instruments are available to borrow.

Music & Culture:

MUS220 / Duration: Semester
Mount Baker Middle School
Grade: 7-8

This is a beginning course in which students engage in creative musical exercises to develop imagination, observation, and concentration. Students also condition their bodies and voices to be flexible, coordinated, and expressive. Students are introduced to musical drama through activities such as improvisation, pantomime, storytelling, characterization, stage directions, and vocal projection. This course includes the basic elements of dramatic production.

Marimba Ensemble

MUS231 / MUS232/ Duration: Year
LaVenture Middle School
Grade: 7-8

Prerequisite: sixth-grade World Music Director's consent upon completion of application

Marimba Ensemble is a year-long music performance elective. Students learn traditional Zimbabwe-Style and contemporary compositions demanding complex form and meters. Students are given leadership rolls through solo and lead playing. Personal responsibility and commitment are shown to the highest level. Marimba performs with the instrumental music department in three formal concerts during the school year, and throughout the Skagit Valley community.

Beginning Guitar

MUS241 / Duration: Year
LaVenture Middle School
Grade: 7-8

This course is a one-semester class that provides beginning guitar training for students who have no prior experience on the instrument. Students will learn to read and play melodies and the most common chords. Students will also become aware of the basic elements of music theory. LaVenture owns a classroom set of nylon string classical guitars which are used in class and can be checked out for home practice after a student and parent or guardian has filled out, signed and returned an instrument loan contract. World Music teaches the skills necessary for success in school and life: respectful communication, listening, and sustained focus.

World Music

MUS230 / Duration: Semester

LaVenture Middle School

Grade: 6

World Music is a one semester class which introduces the music of Africa and Latin America through drumming and playing marimbas. In addition to extending student knowledge of beat, melody, harmony and rhythm, World Music teaches the skills necessary for success in school and life: respectful communication, listening, and sustained focus.

ART COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Intro to Art:

Art200 / Duration: Semester

LaVenture Middle School

Grade: 7 - 8

Mount Baker Middle School

Grade: 6

Students will be introduced to the world of art by completing projects using materials such as charcoal, paint, pastels and clay. We will also learn about several famous artists. Special attention will be given to helping students improve their art skills and vocabulary.

6th Grade Art:

Art210 / Duration: Semester

LaVenture Middle School

Grade: 6

Students will be introduced to the world of art by completing projects using a variety of materials such as painting, collage, pastels, paper-mache, and watercolor. Students will learn the basics of art and be introduced to the seven elements of art, which will be applied to each art project.

Pottery/Sculpture:

Art220 / Duration: Semester

This class will focus on creating sculptures from materials such as clay and wire. Students will learn several techniques for working with clay and glaze.

Color and Painting:

Art230 / Duration: Semester

Mount Baker Middle School

Grade: 7- 8

Other note: This class cannot be repeated.

Students will learn about color theory through watercolor painting, working toward a final self-portrait project. Students will also learn about the history of printing and will learn several printing techniques leading to a final project.

Digital Art

Art240 / Duration: Semester

Mount Baker Middle School

Grade: 7- 8

Other note: This class cannot be repeated.

Students will use drawing and painting apps on classroom iPads as well as learning basic photography skills for creating portraits and advertising. Final project involves group work to "Create your own Culture".

Intro to Tech:

TEC201 / TEC202 / Duration: Semester

LaVenture Middle School

Grade: 7-8

TEC200 / Duration: Semester

Mount Baker Middle School

Grade: 6

This class will cover primary topics: Learning the basics of using productivity software (word processing, spreadsheets, and presentation), introduction to robotics using Spheros, and internet safety among other topics.

Tech II:

TEC211 / TEC 212 / Duration: Semester

LaVenture Middle School

Grade: 7-8

The class will cover more advanced topics of Technology.

Robotics:

TEC210 / Duration: Semester

Mount Baker Middle School

Grade: 7-8

With an economy that has a higher demand for STEM fields, we need to learn how to make a difference in the world. This class will learn basic programming and navigation using Parallax Activity Bots. Students will learn how computer programming can solve problems while exploring basic robotics.

3D Printing:

TEC220 / Duration: Semester

Mount Baker Middle School

Grade: 7-8

This course will cover 2 primary topics: Learning to design and print 3D models and learning basic circuitry and physical computing using the Arduino platform.

Intro to Animation:

TEC230 / Duration: Semester

Mount Baker Middle School

Grade: 7-8

This course will cover introduction to computer animation. Students will work independently and in small groups. Students will work to write, direct and animate computer shorts. Class uses Audacity and Story Maker among other programs.

Office Assistant:

TAO200 / Duration: Semester

Grade: 8

Prerequisite: application

The Attendance Office offers on-the-job training in general office skills and public relations. Students will deliver messages, file, assist with mailings, and help students and staff in a polite and courteous manner. Students will collect attendance records from classrooms.

Leadership:

LED201 / LED202 / Duration: Semester

Grade: 7-8

Prerequisite: application

This semester-long class is for 7th and 8th graders who are dedicated to creating memorable experiences for all students on campus, to promoting school spirit, and to growing as leaders. Leadership students will organize school activities such as dances, assemblies and spirit week, will give presentations to home court classes, and will volunteer at nearby Senior Centers and at Little Mountain Elementary, and much more! MBMS Only: You must apply to be in Leadership class. Once accepted, you will be strongly encouraged to run for an ASB officer position as well as help with 6th grade orientation.

Drama:

DRA200 / Duration: Semester

LaVenture Middle School

Grade: 7-8

In this class, we will learn about and practice basic drama skills like acting, projection, memorization, character, and movement. In addition, we will learn about playwriting, dialogue, and costuming. Students will perform in front of their peers, both in monologues and in scenes with multiple actors. Students will also learn about giving constructive feedback to their peers to help improve acting skills.
